Abstract

This template-file provides the information on how to format a paper to be submitted for ČSŠVK conference. It also can be used as a read-to-modify document.

Keywords: Keyword 1, Keyword 2, ... , Keyword 3, Keyword 4, Keyword 5, ..., up to Keyword 10

1 Page style

Do NOT change predefined page size and margins.

Do NOT change predefined styles or add empty lines in order to make your document “look better”.

Do NOT write titles (e.g. Mgr, Bc, Ing, prof, ...) before or after authors’ names.

When several authors have the same address, use a single reference to the address (the same number should appear by the several authors’ names).

2 Styles

The following styles are provided:

- **Title** – for title of your paper
- **Authors** – for your name(s) and affiliations
- **Footnote Text** – for your e-mail addresses
- **Heading 1** – for titles of sections
- **Heading 2** – for titles of subsections
- **Body Text 0** – for the very first paragraph in the new section
- **Body Text** – for each (but first) paragraph of section
- **References** – for references list
- **List** – for list of properties etc.
- **Enum List** – for enumerated list of properties etc.

Ignore other styles like “Normal” and “Default Paragraph Font” which are default and cannot be deleted from template.

2.1 Subsections

Maximum of two levels of sections should be used. Format the titles of (sub)sections using *Heading1* and *Heading2*, respectively.

Note that previous paragraph is formatted with *BodyText0* because it is first paragraph of this section, while this and following ones are formatted with *BodyText*. You need not care about switching between these two styles manually. The Word should switch automatically between them as you type.

The only difference between *BodyText0* and *BodyText* resides in indenting. The very first paragraph of section is not indented.

Cite the sources as follows [Brualdi and Shader, 1991], [Klee et al., 1984], [Drew et al., 1992]. Bookmark the items in section References, then insert a cross-reference to a bookmark to refer to the item in the text.

3 Numbering

The following sections names should not have a numbering.

- Abstract
- Acknowledgements
- References

Use *Heading1* style for these sections, and discard numbering using the menu “Format / Bullets and Numbering” and selecting “None”.

3.1 Enumeration list

Here is a sample enumeration list.

1. First item
2. Second item. Lorem ipsum dolor sit amet, consectetur adipiscing elit.
3. Third item. Maecenas ante nunc, varius vitae semper non, tincidunt sed eros.

4 Figures

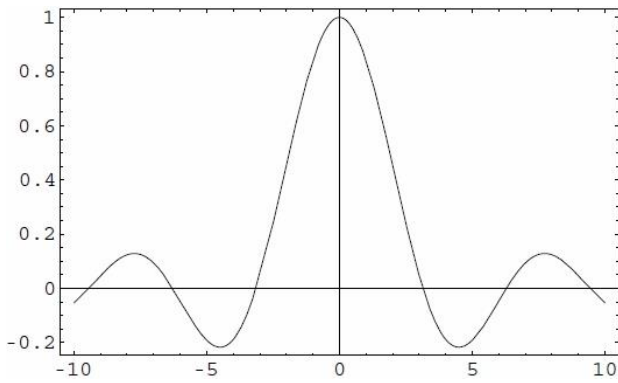


Figure 1: Graph of the function $\sin(x)/x$.

A figure is usually as wide as this paragraph. We recommend to inline the picture to the surrounding text, as shown in Figure 1.

Remember that the texts inside the inserted figure should be approximately as large as the normal text surrounding the figure. The figure and the caption should be centered.

5 Sample text

Cras sit amet enim sed enim sollicitudin vehicula iaculis pharetra lorem.
